Club Meeting Featuring Dr. Lon Abbott – Tuesday, October 11 A Brief Geologic History of Colorado

Dr. Abbott's presentation will take us on a journey through Colorado's geologic history from the formation of the state's first continental crust 1,700 million years ago right up to today. We'll trace the rise and fall of several mountain ranges, watch deserts and seas encroach on the state and then recede, and get to know some of Colorado's early inhabitants.

Dr. Lon Abbott is a Teaching Professor of Distinction and is the Associate Chair of the CU Geological Sciences Department. Chief among his research interests is trying to decipher why Colorado's Rocky Mountains – which are among the world's most enigmatic mountain ranges – exist at all.
