Details are being worked out, so please stay tuned.

Just to mix things up, July 29th has another trip that's close to home as we visit the **National Center for Atmospheric Research**, or NCAR, at Roberts Mesa, in Boulder. We're trying something new with this one by asking members of the public to join us as we go on an FMC-guided hike and tour. We'll check out the NCAR visitor center, architecture, and displays before heading out for a hike that reveals the geology, quarries, climbing routes, and history of the area. This trip will also give you a chance to share your love of geology and your FMC experiences with the public.

Here are other activities of interest in the area for rockhounds of all ages.


