Club Field Trips

We have more field trips planned through the fall. Here is a rundown of trips you can sign up for.

- Gold panning in Lefthand Creek, Saturday, August 10, led by Brian Walko
 This trip is for people interested in learning the science and art of gold placer mining. Miners can keep all gold collected. If a significant find is made, please notify the trip leader for location and photographs. The creek is shallow and a short walk from the parking area.
- Flat Tops above Glenwood Canyon, Saturday and Sunday, August 24 and 25, led by Dennis Gertenbach On this trip, participants will collect goethite pseudomorphs after pyrite and Devonian-age fossils, plus stop at Deep Creek Canyon Overlook. The area is at a high elevation above 10,000ft. Camping is available.
- Crawford, Nebraska, Saturday and Sunday, September 28 and 29, led by Brian Walko We will be collecting agates and fluorescent minerals. On Saturday and Sunday, we will be searching for Fairburn, prairie, picture, and blue agates, plus chalcedony and petrified wood. On Saturday night we will use ultraviolet lamps to search for fluorescent agates and watermelon chalcedony.
- North Table Mountain outside of Golden, October 26, led by Dennis Gertenbach
 North Table Mountain outside of Golden Colorado is a world-renowned site for collecting zeolite
 minerals. Thomsonite, analcime, chabazite, fluorapophyllite, and calcite are relatively common. Other
 minerals may also be found. This is a great trip to take kids, as everyone will find specimens to take
 home.
