Field Trip to Collect Zeolites – Saturday, October 26

North Table Mountain outside of Golden Colorado is a worldrenowned site for collecting zeolite minerals. Thomsonite, analcime, chabazite, fluorapophyllite, and calcite are relatively common. Other minerals may also be found. The site is in Jefferson County Open Space Park, where collecting is allowed. This is a great trip to take kids, as everyone will find specimens to take home. The hike to the collecting site is just over



a mile, climbing about 700 feet in elevation. Children must be accompanied by an adult.


