June 10 Club Meeting – Preparing Specimens for Grab Bags

Our club produces over 1,000 grab bags each year to sell to kids at the Denver Gem & Mineral Show and our club's Rocks & Rails Show. Each grab bag contains 10 specimens of rocks, minerals, and fossils. At our June 10 meeting, we will bag specimens in plastic bags with labels for the grab bags.

The meeting starts at 7:00 pm in Barker Hall at Mountain View United Methodist Church. If you like, bring food to share with others at the meeting.

June and July Field Trips

June 8 - Sugarloaf Mountain

Join Jasper Seldin along with new co-lead and Sugarloaf resident Bob Phillips for a collecting trip close to home. We'll collect ferberite, druzy quartz, and fluorite (and possibly more) from tailings piles of tungsten mines on Sugarloaf Mountain. This field trip is full, but if we get positive feedback from attendees, we will run it a second time later in the year.

June 27-29 - Kemmerer WY Fossil Expedition



This three-day trip begins with an afternoon at Fossil Butte National Monument outside of Kemmerer, Wyoming, for a fossil preparation demonstration, followed by a private talk by Arvid Aase about "Interpreting Climate from Fossil Leaves." On Saturday, we will be at the Fossil Lake Safari pay quarry to collect fossil fish. On the way home on Sunday, we will visit sites south of Wamsutter, Wyoming, to collect "Turritella agate" and stromatolites (fossil algae). There are two signups for the weekend, one for collecting fossil fish on Saturday and one for

the Wamsutter stops on Sunday. If you plan to come both days, sign up for each trip. If you signed up for the quarry dig on Saturday, please submit your \$37.50 fee to the club by cash or check before the trip.

July 12 - Red Feather Lakes Quartz

Join us for a trip to Red Feather Lakes to collect quartz specimens in many rare shapes and colors, as well as hematite and malachite. There is a fee of \$20 for this trip. FMC will cover 50% of the trip's cost for the first two members from each family, lowering the cost for those members to \$10. The sign-up link will be posted in early June.

Here are other activities of interest in the area for rockhounds of all ages.




